

ORDINANCE NO. 2219

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY APPROVING AN AMENDMENT OF THE FY13 GENERAL FUND BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR ADDITIONAL MOSQUITO SPRAYING.

WHEREAS, the Wicomico County Mosquito Control is in "disease suppression mode" due to confirmed West Nile Virus cases in the area; and

WHEREAS, additional spraying beyond the normal budgeted amount is required to occur throughout the City in an attempt to limit the spread of West Nile Virus; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Department Recreation and Culture budget must be increased to accommodate these efforts.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND that the City's Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund budget is hereby amended as follows:


1. Increase the General Fund Revenue Current Surplus Available account (01000-469810) by \$15,000
2. Increase the Public Works Recreation and Culture budget by \$15,000

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its final passage.

THIS ORDINANCE was introduced and read at a meeting of the Council of the City of Salisbury held on the 10th day of September, 2012, and thereafter, a statement of the substance of the Ordinance having been published as required by law, was finally passed by the Council on the 24th day of September, 2012.

Due to confirmed West Nile Virus cases in the area, the Wicomico County Mosquito Control is in "disease suppression mode." As a result, extra spraying will occur throughout the City in an attempt to limit the spread of West Nile Virus.

\$6,000 for FY13 has been encumbered for mosquito spraying. The additional spraying costs could be as high as \$15,000 depending on the weather. We are requesting a budget amendment for the Parks Department budget.
