A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY TO RE-DESIGNATE SIX METERED PARKING SPACES ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE 200 BLOCK OF HIGH STREET FOR PUBLIC WORKS VEHICLE PARKING

WHEREAS, the City maintains a lot for Public Works vehicles on the 200 block of High Street; and

WHEREAS, Public Works has expressed an interest in additional parking for its vehicles; and


WHEREAS, the City has six metered spaces where meters no longer work and are rarely utilized; and


WHEREAS, the City desires to re-designate the spaces for Public Works use.



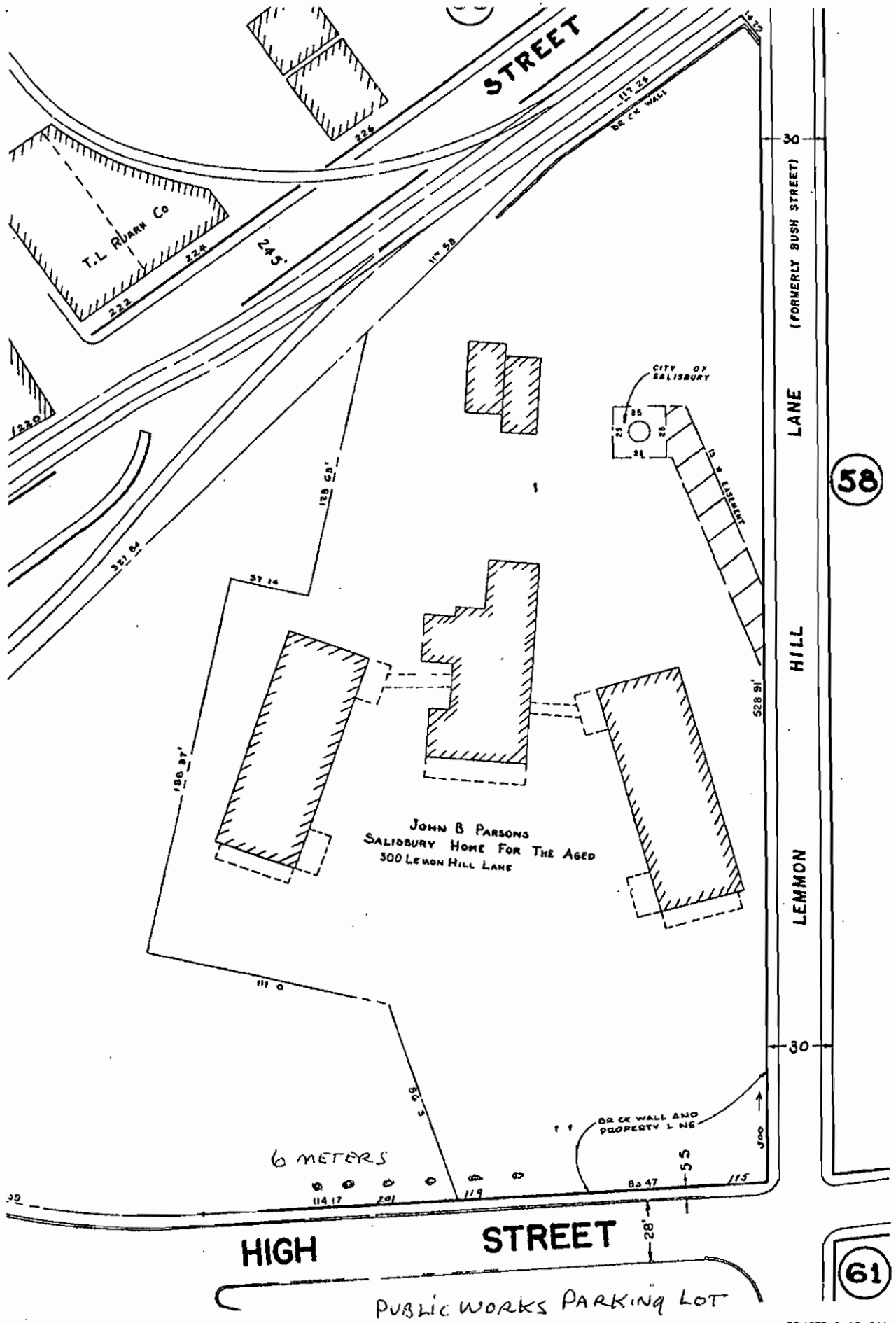

Attached please find a resolution draft to remove six (6) meters on the west side of the 200 block of High Street in front of the John B. Parsons Home. These meters are no longer functioning and Public Works has expressed a need for overflow parking from its lot across the street. Please see the highlighted section of the attached map for the location of the meters. Additionally, there is limited public use of those meters.

The plan would be to remove the old meters if approved by City Council and re-designate the spaces as Public Works Parking only using signage. Attached please find a resolution that would allow for the above described change.
