

RESOLUTION NO. 2067

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY TO ACCEPT EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES AND SERVICES FROM THE WICOMICO COUNTY NARCOTICS TASK FORCE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SALISBURY POLICE DEPARTMENT K-9 UNIT.

WHEREAS, the Salisbury Police Department has an immediate need of a fully trained and certified K-9 Unit to enhance our efforts to combat crime in the City; and

WHEREAS, the Wicomico County Narcotics Task Force seeks to donate equipment and supplies in an amount equal to \$5,000 for the initial costs associated with the establishment of a K-9 Unit; and

WHEREAS, this donation includes purchase of a dual (patrol & narcotics) certified K-9, training of both the dog and its handler, veterinary care and food, supplies and equipment; and


WHEREAS, the Salisbury Police Department has the balance of the funds needed to cover the costs to establish the K-9 Unit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND that the donation of equipment supplies and services having a value of \$5,000 from the Wicomico County Narcotics Task Force be accepted to help establish the Salisbury Police Department's K-9 Unit.

THIS RESOLUTION was duly passed at a meeting of the Council of the City of Salisbury held on June 13, 2011, and is to become effective immediately upon adoption.


