WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury's grant application was approved by the Maryland Historical Trust in the amount of \$1,000.00; and


WHEREAS, this grant requires a 100% match which is traditionally satisfied by Commissioner and/or staff time for travel, training, etc.; and


WHEREAS, the grant was awarded to the City of Salisbury;



Dear Mr. Stevenson,

I am pleased to inform you that **the City of Salisbury has received a grant of \$1,000.00 to support continuing education programs for members of the Historic Preservation Commission and staff.** These funds are being made available through a Certified Local Government grant that will be administered by the Maryland Association of Historic District Commissions (MAHDC) on behalf of 14 CLG's. In Federal Fiscal Year 2011 \$12,850 has been dedicated to helping local historic preservation leaders attend conferences, workshops, lectures, retreats, and other educational activities. These mini-grants have a dollar-for-dollar matching requirement, which can be met through both cash and in-kind time, mileage, and materials. When the match is figured into the total costs, we estimate that each dollar in grant funds will leverage an additional \$1.16 in cash and donated time and expenses. This investment is typically much higher by the time all of the training activities are completed.

As a CLG, the City of Salisbury is among a small group of Maryland communities who have demonstrated a commitment to historic preservation by adhering to the highest levels of planning and performance and committing to maintain a well-qualified and informed Commission. These funds are intended to help you meet the program requirement that all Commission members attend at least one approved education program each year. Many CLG's use these funds to offset the costs of sending Commission members to the Annual Preservation and Revitalization Conference as well as workshops sponsored by Preservation Maryland, MAHDC, and the Archaeological Society of Maryland. Please contact me if you wish to use the funds for other events, including on-site lectures or Commission-specific training sessions to ensure that the event is eligible and will satisfy CLG training requirements. In providing these funds, it is MHT's intention to ensure that local commissioners have the appropriate philosophical, legal, and technical training necessary to make fair and informed decisions about the resources they are charged to protect.

Enclosed with this letter are the reimbursement forms you will need to draw down your grant funds from MAHDC. If you have any questions regarding these forms, please contact MAHDC Treasurer G. Bernard Callan at 301-663-6149. You may receive reimbursement for programs that occur between July 1, 2011 and June 30, 2012.
