





The above resolution was introduced, read and passed at the regular meeting of the Council of the City of Salisbury held on the 12th day of December, 2011.



Dear Mayor Ireton,

Please accept this brief bio prior to my appearance before the City Council work session to consider my re-appointment to the Salisbury Zoo Commission.

Shortly after my arrival in Salisbury in 1966, I became involved with the Zoo through the Jaycees. At that time the Zoo consisted of a bear in a small cage, a spitting llama, a crow that said "hello", and a collection of poorly fed deer.

I was appointed to the Zoo Commission by Mayor Truitt in 1974, and served as chairman from 1982-1986.

During this period I have been involved in the construction of every exhibit, with the exception of the boardwalk, which was the sole creation of Pete Cooper, Public Works Director.

I presently serve as chairman of the By-Laws / Purpose and Procedure Committee. We have developed a purpose and procedure statement for the ten facets of Zoo activity, and reviewed the by-laws of all satellite organizations.

We now have a system in place to review the above in segments throughout the year. This will save time, update all documents, and give all commission members a chance to review all Zoo activity at least once a year.

During my 37 years on the Zoo Commission, I have also served as president of the Salisbury Jaycees and the Rotary Club of Salisbury.

I hope you will favorably consider my re-appointment to the Commission for an additional term.
