A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND ACCEPTING A DONATION OF \$4,879.12 FROM SALISBURY UNIVERSITY FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A NEW MID-BLOCK PEDESTRAIN CROSSWALK ON MILFORD STREET.

WHEREAS, Salisbury University and the City of Salisbury have been working together to address pedestrian safety issues; and

WHEREAS, Salisbury University requested the City of Salisbury add a new mid-block pedestrian crosswalk on Milford Street, between U.S. 13 and Wayne Street; and


WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury will coordinate the installation of the handicap ramps and the signing and striping for the crosswalk; and


WHEREAS, Salisbury University wishes to donate \$4,879.12 to assist in the installation of the mid-block pedestrian crosswalk.



RE: Donation for Installation of Mid-Block
Crosswalk on Milford Street

Salisbury University and the Public Works group have been working together to address pedestrian issues throughout the SU campus. Milford Street is a popular area for pedestrians due to the student housing, recreational facilities and businesses. During a recent field review, we noted a number of students jaywalking on Milford Street between Wayne Street and US 13. To address this issue, a mid-block crosswalk is proposed. The proposed location will provide a clear line of site for pedestrians.

The location will need to be handicap accessible. The City does not currently have the funds to do the installation. Salisbury University has offered to donate \$4,879.12 for the project. The City will coordinate the crosswalk installation. Attached is a Resolution accepting the donation from Salisbury University. The funds will be placed in revenue account 10500-456415-33700
