A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND ACCEPTING THE DONATION OF MATERIALS FOR THE RESTORATION OF THE HISTORIC SMOKEHOUSE AT THE POPLAR HILL MANSION

WHEREAS, the historic smokehouse located on the grounds of the Poplar Hill Mansion had fallen into a state of disrepair over the years; and

WHEREAS, it was the desire of the Friends of the Polar Hill Mansion to restore the smokehouse so that it could be used as a part of the historic programming sponsored by the Friends at the Mansion; and

WHEREAS, the Friends solicited several businesses for the donation of materials to make the restoration project affordable; and

WHEREAS, the Friends have been successful in receiving sufficient donations to proceed with the project.



- Sherwin Williams of Salisbury, who donated 10 gallons of white paint


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council thanks these businesses and the Friends of the Poplar Hill Mansion for their work on this project.
