A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND AGREEING TO THE EXTENSION OF THE ACTING STATUS FOR ERIC BAKER, ACTING CORPORAL.

WHEREAS, the City's Employee Handbook provides that employees can only serve in acting status for a term exceeding six months with the advice and consent of the City Council; and


WHEREAS, Corporal Eric Baker has been serving in acting status since September 8, 2012 and will reach the six month anniversary on March 8, 2013; and





Re: Request for Time Extension: ACTING CORPORAL SALISBURY POLICE DEPARTMENT

I am requesting that the acting status for ACTING CORPORAL, ERIC BAKER be continued until a permanent CORPORAL is appointed. The City's Employee Handbook requires that the City Council provide advice and consent to allow an employee to serve in an acting capacity for more than six months. Eric Baker was named ACTING CORPORAL on September 8, 2012. He is serving in this capacity to cover the Military Leave of Chad Crocket. Acting Corporal Baker will reach his six month anniversary on March 8, 2013.

The Chief of Police is not yet prepared to recommend a new CORPORAL and is requesting an extension for Acting Corporal Baker.
