

Dear Mayor James Ireton Jr. –

I am writing to inform you of my interest in serving as a member of the Central City District Commission. My background, work experience, interests and service to organizations in the Salisbury community have equipped me with the capacity to serve and advise the city on Downtown matters.

I am both a resident of downtown and an employee of a nonprofit organization with an office on The Plaza. Living and working downtown provide me with a unique perspective on the issues downtown businesses and residents face. I walk The Plaza and surrounding areas throughout the day as part of my 'commute' and have identified many opportunities for improvement. I regularly communicate with Downtown business owners and – as a citizen – have even partnered with several businesses to implement a composting program to divert waste and improve our environment.

In my position at Migrant Clinicians Network, I assist in coordinating program activities for several grant-funded projects. I oversee the coordination of project-related activities among project partners, the completion of products and deliverables, and complete quarterly and annual reports according to grant requirements. With MCN, I have developed a robust internship program that engages students from Salisbury University and other higher education institutions. These internships not only provide students with opportunities to learn, they show that meaningful career opportunities exist in Salisbury and in our Downtown.

My experiences with organizations serving arts communities, low-income communities, adjudicated youth, homeless citizens and the environment will serve the city well. Prior to working with MCN, I completed a year-long fellowship with The Choice Program in Baltimore, providing intensive supervision and community-based case management to adjudicated youth and their families. For the past two years I have worked in various capacities with the Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts to provide support for the annual *Artscape* festival, the nation's largest free outdoor art festival. This past March marked the 10th annual Tim Kennard 10 Mile River Run. During the past two years I have spearheaded efforts to reduce the environmental impact of the race, incorporating increased recycling and composting of food and paper waste.

As a member of the Central City District Commission I will work to engage and represent all stakeholders to build partnerships and leverage resources to improve the city and the downtown. Please do not hesitate to contact me by phone or email if you have any questions.
