A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND ACCEPTING A DONATION OF \$2,500.00 FROM SALISBURY UNIVERSITY, A DONATION OF \$2,500.00 FROM SEA GULL CENTURY FOUNDATION, AND A DONATION OF \$1,250.00 FROM bike-SBY FOR THE PROVISION OF THE INITIAL TWO MILES OF PAVEMENT MARKING AND SIGNAGE NECESSARY TO CREATE A BIKE PATH "SPINE" ROUTE FROM DOWNTOWN SALISBURY TO SALISBURY UNIVERSITY.

WHEREAS, Salisbury University, the Sea Gull Century Foundation, bike-SBY and the City of Salisbury have been working together to improve bicycle connectivity between the Downtown Central Business District and Salisbury University;


WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury will coordinate the installation of the signage and pavement marking for the bike paths and shared lanes;




