## **Waste Water Treatment Plant**

In addition to the projects listed above, the city anticipates appropriating \$58,586,200 in the Water Sewer fund during FY 2015 for the construction of the Waste Water Treatment plant. Based on the best available information as of May 2014 it is anticipated that the project will be funded by a bond issuance in the amount of \$33,980,000 and a grant in the amount of \$24,606,200. This breakdown could change once the final BNR/ENR eligibility is made. Prior to proceeding with the appropriation, the city legal debt limit will be evaluated and revised to accommodate the amount of debt required for the project.
