Don't Become A Burglary Victim

Following a few simple steps will reduce the chances of someone entering your home and taking your property.

Exterior Doors

- Exterior doors should be metal or solid wood.
- Use strong door hinges with non-removable or hidden pins.
- Entry door should be well lighted and have a wide-angle door viewer so you can see who is outside without opening the door.

Locks

- Use strong locks.
- Always keep doors and windows locked, even if you are home or gone for a short time.
- Use quality knobs and deadbolts. Look for a deadbolt with a bolt that extends at least one inch when in locked position and has hardened steel inserts.

Sliding Glass Doors

Install keyed locking devices that secure the

door to the frame

- Adjust the track clearances on the doors so they cannot be pushed out of their tracks
- Put a piece of wood or a metal bar in the track to prevent the door from being opened.

Windows

Most standard double-hung windows have thumb-turn locks between the two panels. DON'T rely on these. An inexpensive way to secure these windows is to use the "pin" trick. Drill an angled hole through the top frame of the lower window partially into the frame of the upper window. Then insert a nail or eyebolt. The window cannot be opened until you remove the nail.

Air Conditioners

Window air conditioning units should be bolted to the wall to prevent them from being easily removed from the outside.
