MISSION STATEMENT

The Mayor's Disability Council was established on October 1, 1991 to ensure that the citizens with disabilities of the City of Salisbury have an equitable opportunity to participate in, benefit from and relish the opportunities the community provides, such as housing, employment, transportation, communications, education and entertainment.

The Mayor's Disability Council will have as its charge the following:

1. To advise and assist the Mayor with developing, implementing and maintaining an Americans^{with} Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance Plan for the City of Salisbury.
2. To serve as a resource for the Mayor and the City of Salisbury relative to issues involving the City's compliance and/or concerns expressed by its citizens.
3. To establish a means by which the people with disabilities of Salisbury can formally and efficiently express concerns relative to accessibility and accommodations
4. To advise and assist with developing and maintaining a depository of related information for all concerned citizens.
5. To assist the Mayor, through advocacy, education, and referral, with developing a broader appreciation, and understanding of the attributes of the people with disabilities.
