IN ATTENDANCE

City Administrator Julia Glanz, City Clerk Kimberly Nichols, City Attorney Mark Tilghman, and interested City employees and citizens.

The City Council convened in a Special Meeting via Zoom on August 17, 2020. President Heath called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. followed by a moment of silent meditation.

ADOPTION OF LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

Mr. Boda moved, Ms. Blake seconded, and the vote was unanimous to approve the Special Meeting agenda as presented.

<u>**RESOLUTION**</u> – presented by City Attorney Mark Tilghman

• Resolution No. 3057- authorizing and empowering City of Salisbury to issue and sell two separate series of General Obligation Bonds, one to be issued in the original principal amount not to exceed ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) and to be designated as the "City of Salisbury Water Quality Bond, Series 2020a" and the other to be issued in the original principal amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) and to be designated as "City of Salisbury Water Quality Bond, Series 2020b", and to be issued and sold and the proceeds thereof to be used for and applied for the public purpose of financing or reimbursing costs of the "Mt. Hermon Road Sewer Extension" project

Ms. Jackson moved and Mr. Boda seconded to approve Resolution No. 3057. City Administrator Julia Glanz requested Council consider the second item on the agenda first, as Finance Director Keith Cordrey was presenting Resolution No. 3057, but was having problems connecting to Zoom. Ms. Jackson then withdrew her motion.

ORDINANCE – presented by City Attorney Mark Tilghman

Ordinance No. 2613- 1st reading- amending the FY21 General Fund Budget revising positions and authorizing the restructure of the Salisbury Police Department Command, Supervisory and Officer Position allocation

Ms. Jackson moved, Ms. Blake seconded, and the vote was unanimous to approve *Ordinance No. 2613 for first reading.*

President Heath asked Mr. Tilghman if Council would have to vote on the ordinance again after the trial period of one year. Mr. Tilghman advised the ordinance did not state the change was temporary, but that the Police Department would try the restructure for one year, but the language did not limit the restructure to one year.

RESOLUTION – presented by City Attorney Mark Tilghman

Resolution No. 3057- authorizing and empowering City of Salisbury to issue and sell two separate series of General Obligation Bonds, one to be issued in the original principal amount not to exceed ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) and to be designated as the "City of Salisbury Water Quality Bond, Series 2020a" and the other to be issued in the original principal amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) and to be designated as "City of Salisbury Water Quality Bond, Series 2020b", and to be issued and sold and the proceeds thereof to be used for and applied for the public purpose of financing or reimbursing costs of the "Mt. Hermon Road Sewer Extension" project

Ms. Jackson moved, Mr. Boda seconded, and the vote was unanimous to approve Resolution No. 3057.

Mr. Cordrey provided a summary of the two separate series of the General Obligation Bonds. The 2020a series was a \$90,000 bond and the 2020b was a \$30,000 bond. The proceeds from both would be used to fund the Mt. Hermon Road Sewer Extension project.

With no further business to discuss, the Special Meeting adjourned at 4:46 p.m. whereby Council immediately convened in the regularly scheduled Work Session.
