ZOO Director's REPORT:

March ZC meeting

Staffing:

Keeper position – Adrienne Liszkiewicz starts Monday, March 14.

Gary, after 48 years of service, has decided his last day will be April 22, 2022. He does not want anything done for his retirement. I've submitted his letter of resignation to HR and Field Ops Director. Once we have the appropriate signature, the position posting for a Keeper II and Keeper III will be put out on the city website.

Animals:

We have a lead for a potential placement for the Black neck swan and both gators. It will be difficult to place them together. (After completing our master exhibit review, there were a variety of aspects in the gator exhibit identified as below minimal standards.) It was determined we would have to do a complete overhaul of the exhibit to consider keeping them. A variety of discussions took place on the reality of us being able to manage them. Tameeka feels the girls are too large for us to handle safely and with the exhibit concerns, it was decided to try and find a location where they could live providing appropriate space and staff to manage them.

The capybara, Vanessa passed between Friday, March 4 and Saturday, March 5. Tameeka has been treating her for a variety of GI issues. Vanessa had just undergone a procedure in Baltimore Friday morning in expectation of eliminating the health issues.

The Education Ambassador Merlin is in the hospital in quarantine. If all results come back as needed, he should be out by the end of March.

We have a place to potential relocate the black neck swan and gators.

Projects:

The East Kiosk will be refurbished starting March 15 by a volunteer group from Gillis Gilkerson. This is a community "give-back" project. Termite damage was discovered.

Chuck is working with the city DID staff to get the appropriate maps and information required to submit our first application to MDE.

Ocelot Holding Eagles scout is complete. The project for Tropics Trail pond restoration should be completed early in April.

Zoo Happenings:

Several Service groups will be in the zoo prior to Earth Day to help get the winter remains out!

Story time starts in April with LEAF, Earth Day, Wild about Reading and lots of school programming to follow-more from Education.

We are not 100% sure when the trailer will be complete and delivered. The last update I had from Charles indicated he had not been told anything new, so we are hoping all still goes according to plan and it will be completed and delivered by the end of May. Once onsite, utilities, phone, security, electric and IT hook ups will have to take place prior to the staff being able to occupy. I'm guessing it will be mid to late June before all of that happens and we are in place. The building height may have to be raised to accommodate a ramp for ADA.

A capital campaign get-together will be held in June to reacquaint the public with the zoo.

Jack at Field Operat000ions gave us space for office materials to be stored.

A pavilion is planned for the stage area with a permeable surface. Funds could come from Project Open Space.
