Olive Full Gospel Baptist Church provided the invocation, and afterwards everyone recited the pledge to the flag.

ORDINANCE- presented by City Attorney Heather Konyar

- **Ordinance No. 2729- 2nd reading**- *amending Chapter 5.64 of the Salisbury City Code, entitled "Towing Companies", to update procedures for dispatching police directed towing, operations of a police directed tow on scene, and penalties for violations of the code*

Ms. Blake moved and Ms. Gregory seconded to approve Ordinance No. 2729 for second reading.

Ms. Gregory moved, Ms. Blake seconded and the vote was 3-0 to amend Ordinance No. 2729 for second reading as read by Ms. Bosche.

Ordinance No. 2729 for second reading, as amended, was unanimously approved on a 3-0 vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no requests from the public to speak.

ADMINISTRATION AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Day noted the excellent job by City departments in supporting the Juneteenth celebration and Pride Event held Downtown over the weekend. Both were well attended parades and with the exception of heat related injuries, everything ran very smoothly.


Ms. Gregory reiterated what the Mayor said, and she loved seeing so many people out enjoying Downtown.
