A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND ACCEPTING A DONATION FROM EAGLE SCOUT SETH ROBERTS, BOY SCOUT TROOP #149 OF DELMARVA COUNCIL, TO CONSTRUCT AND GIFT TWO PARK BENCHES TO THE CITY OF SALISBURY FOR USE IN THE CITY PARK.

WHEREAS, the opportunity exists for the City of Salisbury to offer young leaders a chance to engage in service projects that will aid in their leadership development; and

WHEREAS, these projects typically have the effect of benefitting the entire community, and


WHEREAS, Life Scout Roberts would like to donate two park benches or "Buddy Benches" that he designed, constructed and will assist with the installation of for his Eagle Scout Project, and

WHEREAS, it was his intent to place the benches in the City Park, for the peaceful use and enjoyment by residents and visitors alike.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Salisbury, Maryland does hereby accept the donation of two park benches, valued at \$128.00 (one hundred and twenty eight dollars) for use in the Salisbury City Park.

Attached, please find a resolution that will have the effect of accepting the donation of two park benches from Mr. Seth Roberts.

As part of his Eagle Scout Project, Mr. Roberts constructed two park benches that he would like to donate to the City of Salisbury for peaceful use and enjoyment by our residents and visitors.

The benches are well crafted utilizing pressure treated lumber and galvanized fasteners. They are approximately 56" (fifty-six inches) in length and have a seating height of 16 1/2" (sixteen and one half inches). The construction cost was \$128.00 (one hundred and twenty eight dollars). That stated their overall worth far exceeds their material value.

With Mayor and Council approval, the idea is to place one bench on Picnic Island and one bench at Ben's Red Swings.
