CITY INVOCATION – PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The City Council met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. via Zoom and in person. Council President John R. “Jack” Heath called the meeting to order. After the recital of the pledge to the flag, J. Anthony Dickerson of the Greater Mt. Olive Full Gospel Baptist Church provided the invocation.

ADOPTION OF LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

Ms. Jackson moved, Mr. Boda seconded, and the vote was unanimous (3-0) to approve the legislative agenda as presented.

CONSENT AGENDA- presented by City Clerk Kimberly Nichols

Council President Heath announced he would abstain from the vote on the Consent Agenda because of potential perceived conflict of interest with one of the items.

The Consent Agenda, consisting of the following items, was approved on a 2-0 vote on a motion and seconded by Mr. Boda and Ms. Jackson, respectively:

- **Resolution No. 3181**– to re-appoint Marina Feeser to the Sustainability Advisory Committee with term ending August 2025
- **Resolution No. 3182** – declaring Granger & Magee PA eligible to receive Enterprise Zone benefits for property located at 145 East Carroll Street, Salisbury, MD
- **Approving the Manufacturing Exemption** requests for Viskon (for years 2019 and 2020)
- **August 1, 2022** Work Session Minutes
- **August 1, 2022** Special Meeting Minutes

RESOLUTION- presented by City Administrator Julia Glanz

- **Resolution No. 3183**– to wind down LOSAP for volunteer members of the Salisbury Fire Department and adopt a Volunteer Member Incentive Policy

Ms. Jackson moved, Mr. Boda seconded, and the vote was unanimous to approve Resolution No. 3183.

ORDINANCE- presented by City Attorney Ashley Bosche

- **Ordinance No. 2734**- 1st reading- to permit townhouse developments in General Commercial districts

Ms. Jackson moved, Mr. Boda seconded, and the vote was unanimous to approve Ordinance No. 2734 for first reading.


