Public Participation in City Council Meetings

- 1. In accordance with the Maryland Open Meetings Act, the general public is entitled to attend and observe all meetings of the Mayor and Council except in appropriate circumstances when meetings of the public bodies may be closed under the Act.
- 2. To encourage community engagement, the Council allows public comment using the following guidelines:
 - a. Work Sessions persons desiring to speak on matters specific to the topics on the agenda may do so for up to three (3) minutes after each topic has been presented.
 - b. Regular Meetings persons desiring to speak on any matter may do so for up to four (4) minutes during the "Public Comments" portion of the meeting.
 - c. Please fill out a comment form from the table as you enter Council Chambers, and turn it in to the Clerk.
 - d. The Council President will call you up to the podium. For the record, please state your name, whether you are a resident within the corporate limits of Salisbury, and any organization affiliation you are representing.
 - e. Questions posed by the public during the public comment portion will be logged and tracked by the City Clerk. The City Clerk will forward the questions to the appropriate individual or body for a response.
- 3. Those in attendance shall be courteous to one another, the Council, and to the proceedings while the Council is in session. Side conversations within the Council Chambers should be kept to a minimum and should not be disruptive.
- 4. The public body may have an individual removed if it is determined that the behavior of the individual is disruptive. Engaging in verbal comments intended to insult or slander anyone may be cause for termination of speaking privileges and/or removal from Council Chambers.
- 5. Please approach the City Clerk if you have questions or materials for the Council.

Over the past several months of below average temperatures and heavy rains, the Salisbury Zoo, a division of the Arts, Business and Culture Department, has experienced significant equipment and facility failures resulting in an unexpected shortfall in our operating funds. Due to these emergency repairs, our budget will not be sufficient enough to last through the remainder of FY24.

A breakdown of these expenses are as follows:

- Heating/Cooling Unit Repairs \$40,000
 - o Sloth Exhibit
 - o Flamingo Exhibit
 - o Spec Owls Exhibit
 - o Animal Hospital
 - o Radiant Panel Heaters
- Education Building Roof Replacement \$10,000

The Salisbury Zoo will require \$50,000 in their Buildings account 40000-534301 in order to properly maintain operations and routine exhibit maintenance.

Re: Critical Area Map Update

In the Spring of 2008, legislation was passed and signed into law that required the State to work cooperatively with local governments to update the Critical Area Maps in all affected jurisdictions. The legislation directed the Department of Natural Resources to prepare a Statewide Base Map that includes a State-determined shoreline and landward boundary of tidal wetlands and a digitally generated, geo-referenced 1,000-foot Critical Area boundary, as appropriate for integration into a Geographic Information System.


As the mapping update project progressed, the draft updated maps were made available to the public, so that additional review and comment on the maps can take place. The Critical Area Commission notified 74 property owners with a greater than 1% change in November 2021. On February 9, 2022 the Critical Area Commission transferred the maps to the City.

The proposed map is attached showing a net loss of 40 acres. This loss is not unexpected as the original map used the 1972 State Wetland maps to determine the boundary. GIS and recent aerial imagery provide a more accurate assessment of wetlands and shorelines used to draw the boundary. In addition, a large portion of the City's shoreline is hardened with bulkheading or revetments that would limit change.

Amendments to the Critical Area District require a public hearing by the Planning Commission and recommendation to the City Council for their consideration at a public hearing prior to adoption.

The local adoption process requires a public hearing by the Salisbury Planning Commission followed by a public hearing with the Salisbury City Council. The public hearing at the Planning Commissions is scheduled for February 15, 2024. Following a favorable recommendation from the Salisbury Planning Commission the maps will be forwarded to the City Council.

The Ethics Commission has prepared and is submitting for your review a Code of Ethics for Boards/Commissions/Committees members. It was determined that no such Code existed for these stakeholder groups and would be beneficial for establishing standards and rules of conduct for members, providing uniformity in expectations for all stakeholder groups, and helping foster an environment of trust, integrity, and ethical conduct. This Code of Ethics will be part of a future onboarding process for Boards/Commissions/Committee members pending your approval of this document. The Boards/Commissions/Committees Code of Ethics is being presented by Dr. Timothy Stock , Chair of the Ethics Commission and Ashley Bosche, City Attorney.

City of Salisbury Code of Ethics

Members of the City of Salisbury stakeholder groups, including Boards, Commissions, Committees, and Task Forces, are entrusted with advising and governing, with the goal of contributing to the well-being of our community. We acknowledge our duty to serve with the utmost integrity, transparency, and accountability; this Code of Ethics outlines the principles and standards that guide our actions.

Duty to the Public: We commit ourselves to act in the best interests of an equitable and inclusive community, making decisions that prioritize the long-term public good over personal gain or limited interests.

Honesty and Transparency: We shall always be honest and transparent in our process. This includes full, fair, accurate, timely and understandable communication of public information, and being explicit and forthright in the reasons behind our actions or decisions.

Accountability: We accept responsibility for our personal and organizational decisions and actions, and we will rectify mistakes promptly.

Avoiding Conflicts of Interest: We shall avoid situations that may create a conflict of interest, including disclosure of conflicts or apparent conflicts, the review of those conflicts by others, and recusing ourselves from decisions where appropriate. We will understand the role of bias and adopt policies that will mitigate bias in decision making.

Compliance with Laws: We shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations, ensuring that our actions are lawful and conform to the governing principles and ordinances of our City.

Professional Demeanor and Ethical Leadership: We shall maintain a professional demeanor and ethical leadership in all interactions, including collaborative and informed conflict management.

Efficient Resource Management: We shall exercise prudent financial management and use resources efficiently, avoiding wasteful or unauthorized expenditures, and engage in transparent and equitable fiscal and procurement practices.

Non-Discrimination and Equal Opportunity: We shall not discriminate against any individual or group based on race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, disability, or any other protected status. We will create inclusive and culturally sensitive events, policies, and practices.

Confidentiality: We shall maintain the confidentiality of non-public information entrusted to us, using such information only for official purposes and never for personal gain. We do so in

compliance with all applicable laws and in consultation with legal counsel where appropriate, and continually, even if required beyond the tenure of our official roles.

Civility and Respect: We shall conduct ourselves with respect, dignity, and courtesy when interacting with fellow stakeholders, City employees, and the public. We will foster opportunities to listen to concerns, and will address with the intent of eliminating bullying, harassment, and intimidation.

Community Engagement: We shall actively seek public input, provide prompt response, communicate regularly, and otherwise seek to engage with the community to understand and address their needs, and barriers to those needs being served.

Open Meetings: We shall adhere to open meeting laws and encourage public participation in our deliberations and decision-making processes. We will make documents publicly available, advertise meetings in advance, and engage in closed meetings only when deemed necessary or required by law.

Reporting Wrongdoing: If a stakeholder becomes aware of unethical or illegal behavior within their stakeholder group or the City, they shall report such conduct to the appropriate authority or supervisor. We support and uphold whistleblower protection mechanisms and expect all employees to foster a culture where such reporting can occur without fear of reprisal.

Accountability for Violations: Violations of this Code of Ethics may result in appropriate disciplinary action, including removal from the position, as determined by the relevant authority.

This Code of Ethics is intended to guide the actions of City stakeholders, fostering trust, integrity, and responsibility in our community. We commit to upholding these principles and continuously striving for the betterment of the City of Salisbury. Detailed provisions as to policies and procedures regarding this document are available in the City Employee Handbook and the **RELEVANT SECTION OF CITY CODE**.

The Election Board met In December and January with City Attorney Ashley Bosché and the Clerks Office to discuss amendments to the Charter and Code. The amendments include the following:

- Code Amendment
 - <u>City of Salisbury Election Board</u>- to amend Chapter 1.08 of the Salisbury City Code, entitled "Election Board," to adopt recommendations made by the City of Salisbury Election Board regarding the application for mail-in ballots and the canvassing of ballots

It is further the intention of the Council of the City of Salisbury that if any 111 section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall be adjudged invalid, 112 unconstitutional, or otherwise unenforceable under applicable Maryland or federal law, such 113 adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision so 114 adjudged and all other provisions of this Resolution shall remain and shall be deemed valid and 115 enforceable.

8	WHEREAS, the ongoing application, administration and enforcement of the City of Salisbury				
9	Municipal Code (the "Salisbury City Code") demonstrates a need for its periodic review, evaluation and

11	safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Salisbury (the "City"); and

13	WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury (the "Mayor and Council") are				
14	authorized by MD Code, Local Government, § 5-202, as amended, to adopt such ordinances, not contrary

Each board of canvassers shall 63 keep the ballots safe from tampering until the canvass is completed. The 64 county board shall take all appropriate and feasible steps to protect the 65 privacy of all mail-in ballots. 66
 - 2. The canvass may not be completed until all mail-in ballots that have been received timely have been counted.

 - The county board receives the ballot from the United States Postal d. Service not later than [[four p.m.]] ten a.m. on the second Friday following election day.
 - Except as provided in subsection D of this section, any ballot received after 2. the deadline established in this subsection may not be counted.
- D. Ballots Received from Locations Outside United States. 84
