ORDINANCE NO. 2892

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY APPROVING A BUDGET AMENDMENT OF THE FY2025 GENERAL FUND BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE SALISBURY FIRE DEPARTMENT'S OPERATING BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the City has declared thirty-five (35) Motorola APX 6000 series portable radios as surplus; and

WHEREAS the radios have been sold at auction per City Procurement guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a total \$16,927.50 from the proceeds generated from the auction sale and placed the funds in the City General Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Department has use for the funds received and requests that the funds of \$16,927.50 be reallocated to the Fire Department Operating Budget for FY2025; and

WHEREAS, the budget amendment as provided herein must be made upon the recommendation of the Mayor and the approval of four-fifths of the Council of the City of Salisbury.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND, as follows:

Section 1. The City of Salisbury's Fiscal Year 2025 General Fund Budget be and is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) Increase the Sale of Fixed Assets Account (01000-469200) by \$16,927.50
- (b) Increase the Salisbury Fire Department's Building Account (24035-534301) by \$16,927.50:

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND, as follows:

WHEREAS, during the course of the past few months, the City Executives have been assessing and formulating position and grade changes that will be of benefit to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury has determined the need to reorganize several positions and revise the Authorized Position Counts in several departments; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury has determined that there is a need to change pay grades assigned to several positions; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury has determined that no additional funding is required to make the update; and

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY AMENDING SUBCHAPTER 10.04.040, ENTITLED "ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS", OF THE SALISBURY CITY CODE TO CLARIFY WHICH CITY PERSONNEL ARE AUTHORIZED TO ACT AS ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.

WHEREAS, the ongoing application, administration and enforcement of the City of Salisbury Municipal Code (the "Salisbury City Code") demonstrates a need for its periodic review, evaluation and amendment, in order to comply with present community standards and values, and promote the public safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Salisbury (the "City");

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury (the "Mayor and Council") are authorized by MD Code, Local Government, § 5-202 to adopt such ordinances, not contrary to the Constitution of Maryland, public general law or public local law, as the Mayor and Council deem necessary to assure the good government of the municipality, to preserve peace and order, to secure persons and property from damage and destruction, and to protect the health, comfort and convenience of the citizens of the City;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council may amend the Salisbury City Code pursuant to the authority granted in § SC 2-15 of the Salisbury City Charter;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find that amendments to Subchapter 10.04.040 of the Salisbury City Code are desirable to update the Code to clarify which city personnel are authorized to act as "enforcement officers"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that the amendments to Subchapter 10.04.040 of the Salisbury City Code set forth below shall be adopted as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND, that Subchapter 10.04.040 of the Salisbury City Code is hereby amended by adding the bolded and underlined language and deleting the strikethrough language as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Subchapter 10.04.040 of the Salisbury City Code, entitled "Enforcement officers" is amended as follows:

10.04.040 Enforcement officers.

- A. Except with regard to parking meter violations, it It shall be the duty of the police officers, or other authorized parking enforcement personnel, of the city authorized employees of the Salisbury Police Department, Housing and Community Development Department, Salisbury Fire Department, Department of Field Operations or any other department of the City of Salisbury as authorized by the Chief of Police, who shall be referred to as "Enforcement Officer" in this subchapter with reference to vehicles parked, operated or driven in violation of this chapter or rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, to report:
 - 1. The state license number of any such vehicle;
 - 2. The nature of the violation and the time and place thereof;
- 42 3. Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.

B. In the case of a parking violation, each police officer, authorized parking enforcement personnel, of the city an Enforcement Officer making such a report also shall attach to such vehicle or deliver to the operator thereof, if present in the vehicle, a notice to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle has been illegally parked and instructing such owner or operator where and when he may make payment of the penalty for such violation and the amount of the penalty for such violation; in case of any other violation, each police officer, authorized parking enforcement personnel, of the city Enforcement Officer making such a report also shall deliver to the operator or driver of such vehicle a notice that such vehicle has been operated or driven in violation of this chapter and instructing such operator or driver to appear at the district court for the county at the time and on the date specified in such notice with regard to such violation.

Council,

The Housing and Community Development Department is transitioning its code enforcement process, rental registration program, and all associated forms and applications to an online platform, OpenGov. This platform will facilitate electronic communication via email for registered users, allowing for the prompt delivery of warning letters regarding municipal code violations.

By utilizing OpenGov, we aim to enhance service to both the City and property owners. This system will ensure timely notifications, giving property owners sufficient opportunity to address any violations before formal municipal infractions are issued.

Once landlords or property owners register and verify their properties, they will receive notifications instantly. In instances where they are registered on OpenGov, physical letters will no longer be mailed. Please note that the Municipal Citation process remains unchanged, as it is governed by court requirements.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY AMENDING TITLE 8 OF THE SALISBURY CITY CODE, ENTITLED "HEALTH AND SAFETY," TO ALLOW FOR ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION AS AN OPTION FOR WARNING LETTERS FOR MUNICIPAL CODE VIOLATION NOTICES.

WHEREAS, the ongoing application, administration, and enforcement of the City of Salisbury Municipal Code (the "Salisbury City Code") demonstrates a need for its periodic review, evaluation, and amendment to comply with present community standards and values and promote public safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Salisbury (the "City");

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury (the "Mayor and Council") are authorized by MD Code, Local Government, § 5-202 to adopt such ordinances, not contrary to the Constitution of Maryland, public general law or public local law, as the Mayor and Council deem necessary to assure the good government of the municipality, to preserve peace and order, to secure persons and property from damage and destruction, and to protect the health, comfort and convenience of the citizens of the City;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council may amend Title 8 (Health and Safety) of the Salisbury City Code pursuant to the authority granted in § SC 2-15 of the Salisbury City Charter;

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Department is moving its code enforcement process, rental registration program, and all department forms and applications to an online platform called OpenGov, which will allow for electronic communication via email with registered accounts in the platform;

WHEREAS, allowing delivery of warning letters for municipal code violations via electronic means will better serve the City and property owners, as it will provide for prompt notification, and will afford property owners ample opportunity to correct violations prior to the issuance of municipal infractions; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that the amendments to Title 8 of the Salisbury City Code shall be adopted as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY COUNCIL OF THE CITY **OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND**, that Title 8 – Health and Safety of the Salisbury City Code is hereby amended by adding the bolded and underlined language and deleting the strikethrough language as follows:

Section 1. Section 8.08.030 of the Salisbury City Code of the Salisbury City Code, entitled "Warning letter of violation" is amended as follows:

8.08.030 Warning letter of violation.

When a violation of Section 8.08.010 or 8.08.020 occurs, a warning letter of violation shall be sent to the owner or occupant of the property. This warning letter of violation shall:

- 1. State that the condition must be removed from the property within ten days of the date of the notice,
- 2. State that the Housing and Community Development Department shall conduct a re-inspection of the property after ten days have passed since the date of the notice.
- 51 E. For a second violation in any calendar year:

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- 1. State that the condition must be removed from the property within seven days of the date of the notice,
- 2. State that the Housing and Community Development Department shall conduct a reinspection of the property after seven days have passed since the date of the notice.
- F. State that, if during the inspection of the premises, the violation complained of in the warning letter is found, it shall be abated by the city as soon as practicable, and the costs of such abatement shall be specially assessed and shall be deemed a personal debt against the owner and constitute a lien against the property from which abated;
- G. State that upon violation of Section 8.08.010 or 8.08.020, the owner shall be guilty of a municipal infraction, and upon conviction shall be fined twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for a first offense and fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each day the condition remains unabated up to a maximum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00);
 - H. Be served by one of the following methods:
 - 1. By depositing the notice or order in the United States Post Office, first class first-class postage prepaid, addressed to the owner at his last known address as recorded in the real estate assessment records of the city and by posting a copy of the notice or order in a conspicuous place on the property subject to the order.
 - 2. By hand-delivering the notice to the person to be notified; or
 - 3. By leaving the notice at the usual residence or place of business of the person to be notified with a person of suitable age and discretion then resident or employed therein:

Re: Critical Area Map Adoption Ordinance

In the Spring of 2008, legislation was passed and signed into law that required the State to work cooperatively with local governments to update the Critical Area Maps in all affected jurisdictions. The legislation directed the Department of Natural Resources to prepare a Statewide Base Map that includes a State-determined shoreline and landward boundary of tidal wetlands and a digitally generated, georeferenced 1,000-foot Critical Area boundary, as appropriate for integration into a Geographic Information System.

In February 2024, Planning Commission held a Public Hearing to adopt the revised maps. The maps were forwarded on to City Council for a work session, where the Council motioned to have to maps sent to legislative session for additional public hearings. At that time, the net gain/net loss maps were brought before the Commission and Council, but the maps detailing the designations of Intensely Developed Area (IDA), Limited Developed Area (LDA), and Resource Conservation Area (RCA) were not included. These designations delineate areas in need of greater protection, and each designation has its own set of development standards and environmental controls. The delineations are crucial to the implementation of the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Program. At the June 20, 2024 Planning Commission Meeting, the Planning Commission voted favorably to move to a Public Hearing for the proposed Ordinance to adopt both the maps and the delineations at the July 18, 2024 meeting. The Planning Commission held a Public Hearing on July 18, 2024 and forwarded onto City Council for their review.


