Works with Education Department to ensure proper animal husbandry standards are met. Acts as safety liaison to the city as well as setting up and coordinating monthly safety drills for the facility. Collaborate with AZA Pathways representative to meet accreditation standards. Perform other duties as assigned.



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Duties and Responsibilities

Administration/Department Administration: Be a lead and help with the overall animal care team and procedures while performing routine animal husbandry duties for living collections.

- Mentor animal care staff to foster proper animal husbandry techniques.
- Asses animal care staff and perform quarterly/annual reviews.
- Observes animals for odd behavior or illness.
- Assists the veterinarian in the treatment of animals with illnesses or injuries.
- Mentor/share expertise with other animal care staff.
- Assists with facility maintenance.
- Coordinates with other staff members exhibit inspections.
- Prepares Maintenance work orders.
- · Coordinate with other staff members new exhibit planning.
- Help with general maintenance as needed.
- Performs and records animal observations.
