

Position Profile: The Water Treatment Plant Operator controls treatment plant machines and equipment to purify and clarify water for human consumption and industrial use. Responsible for all equipment needs and scheduled maintenance. Performs other duties as assigned and additional responsibilities with career ladder advancement.

Duties and Responsibilities

Administrative Planning/Task Completion: Holds self-accountable for assigned responsibilities; sees task through to completion in a timely manner.

- Operates and controls electric motors, pumps and valves to regulate flow of raw water into treatment plant.
- Adds specified amounts of chemicals such as chlorine, and lime into water; adjusts automatic devices that admit specified amounts of chemicals into tank to disinfect and clarify water.
- Starts agitators to mix chemicals and allow impurities to settle to bottom of tank.
- Turns valves to regulate water through filter beds to remove impurities.
- Pumps purified water into water mains.
- Monitors panel-board; adjusts controls to regulate flow rates, loss of head pressure and water elevation and distribution of water.
- Cleans tanks and filter beds using backwashing.
- Repairs and lubricates machines and equipment.
- Tests water samples to determine acidity, color and impurities.
- Adds chemicals.
- Records data such as residual content of chemicals, water turbidity and water pressure.
- Operates potable water purification plant to supply drinking water.
- Keeps supervisor informed of unusual or detrimental conditions including equipment malfunctions and process problems.

Skills Proficiency/Technical: Skillful in tools, hardware, software, and equipment of the Water Treatment Plant.

- Working knowledge of City policies and procedures.
- Act as a representative of the City of Salisbury to the public.
- Thorough knowledge of water treatment and plant operations.

- Knowledge of purchasing rules and regulations.
- Observe all safety rules and process directives.
- Safely operate vehicles, tools, and equipment.
- Follow written and oral instructions.
- Effectively communicate and maintain effective working relationships with other staff members and members of the public.
- Knowledge of the materials, tools and methods used in general construction, repairs, maintenance and operations of treatment plants and related pump stations.
- Knowledge of the operation and maintenance of motors pumps and related equipment.
