Victim: Denise Horsey

The Salisbury Police Department announces that a suspect has been charged in connection with a homicide that occurred nearly two decades ago.

On April 8, 2006 Salisbury Police officers were called to an alleyway near the 300 block of Naylor Street for the report of a woman yelling. When they arrived, they located Denise Horsey suffering from multiple stab wounds. Ms. Horsey was transported to the hospital but unfortunately succumbed to her injuries. On September 22, 2025 a Wicomico County Grand Jury indicted Tyrone Leroy Hughey (43) of Hagerstown, Maryland for the death of Denise Horsey. Mr. Hughey, although charged, is presumed innocent unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This investigation reflects the commitment the Salisbury Police Department has to our community. No matter how much time passes, we remain determined to seek justice for victims and their families. This case also stands as a reminder that no one is forgotten or left behind, as demonstrated by the determined investigative work and interagency collaboration of SPD and the willingness of caring community members to assist the Department in its efforts. Due to the sensitive nature of the investigation and the ongoing legal proceedings, further details cannot be released at this time.
