

ORDINANCE NO. 2975

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY APPROVING A BUDGET AMENDMENT OF THE FY2026 GENERAL FUND BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FIELD OPERATIONS BUDGET.

WHEREAS, street maintenance and solid waste collection and disposal in the City are of vital importance; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation and Streets Division's vehicles repair cost have increased causing a need for daily unexpected maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Division within the Department of Field Operations has a vehicle maintenance budget currently at \$26,757.10 and the Streets Department of Field Operations has a vehicle maintenance budget of \$3,494.32 for the remainder of FY2026; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Division within the Department of Field Operations has estimated \$90,000 would be required for the remainder of FY2026 to properly maintain their current sanitation fleet allowing for sanitation collection to stay within schedule; and the Steet's Division within the Department of Field Operations has estimated \$30,000 would be required for their remainder of the FY2026 to properly maintain their current streets fleet allowing for proper street maintenance.

WHEREAS, the budget amendment as provided herein must be made upon the recommendation of the Mayor and the approval of four-fifths of the Council of the City of Salisbury.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND, as follows:

Section 1. The City of Salisbury's Fiscal Year 2026 General Fund Budget be and is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) Increase the Current Year Surplus Account (01000-469810) by \$120,000 and
- (b) Increase the Sanitation Division's Vehicle Account (32061-534308) by \$90,000 and
- (c) Increase the Streets Division's Vehicle Account (31150-534308) by \$30,000

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND, as follows:

Section 2. It is the intention of the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury that each provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein.


Section 3. It is further the intention of the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury that if any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable under applicable Maryland or federal law, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision so adjudged and all other provisions of this Ordinance shall remain and shall be deemed valid and enforceable.

Section 4. The recitals set forth hereinabove are incorporated into this section of the Ordinance as if such recitals were specifically set forth at length in this Section 4.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its final passage.

THIS ORDINANCE was introduced and read at a Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Salisbury held on the 2 day of February, 2026 and thereafter, a statement of the substance of the Ordinance having been published as required by law, in the meantime, was finally passed by the Council of the City of Salisbury on the 2 day of March, 2026.


