Purpose. To provide information to the City Council on the proposed Home Depot donation to encourage recycling at the Salisbury Zoo.


Line Upfront Recommendation: I request the City Council accept the donation through the enclosed resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 1158

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND ACCEPTING TWELVE RECYCLING AND TRASH RECEPTACLES FROM THE HOME DEPOT FOR THE SALISBURY ZOOLOGICAL PARK.
