RESOLUTION NO. 1170

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND TO APPROVE A MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST (MHT) GRANT APPLICATION FOR FUNDS TO DEVELOP A SET OF COMPREHENSIVE DESIGN GUIDELINES FOR THE RENOVATION, REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF PROPERTIES LOCATED IN THE THREE HISTORIC DISTRICTS OF SALISBURY.

WHEREAS, the Maryland Historical Trust has solicited applications from eligible jurisdictions to apply for funding under the Maryland Historical Trust Non-Capital Historic Preservation Grant Program for fiscal year 2006; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salisbury is eligible to apply for funds from the Maryland Historical Trust; and

WHEREAS, the grant requires a 100% match (50% of the total project budget) for grant applications;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Salisbury, Maryland does hereby authorize the submission of an application for Non-Capital Grant funds in the amount of \$25,000 with the City to contribute a 100% match for a total grant application of \$50,000; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Mayor Barrie P. Tilghman is authorized and empowered to execute any and all documents required for the submission of this grant application.

THE ABOVE RESOLUTION was introduced and duly passed at a meeting of the Council of the City of Salisbury, Maryland held on November 22, 2004, and is to become effective immediately.
