RESOLUTION NO. 1391

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION OF LAND ON UPSHUR STREET UPON WHICH A REGIONAL STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITY WILL BE CONSTRUCTED BY THE CITY

- WHEREAS, the Owner of Parcel 2143, State of Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation Tax Map 115, located on the west side of Upshur Street within the incorporated limits of the City of Salisbury, MD, has offered to donate a 16,725.58 square-foot portion of said parcel to the City for use as a regional stormwater management facility; and
- WHEREAS, preparation of the subdivision plat and deed that will formally separate the donated portion of Parcel 2143 from the remainder of Parcel 2143 shall be the responsibility of the City, and
- WHEREAS, the design and construction of the stormwater management facility, to include acquisition of all permits as necessary, shall be the responsibility of the City, and
- WHEREAS, the Monticello Avenue storm drain collection system floods at several locations during intense but infrequent storm events, and
- WHEREAS, construction of this regional stormwater management facility will reduce the frequency and extent of flooding along the Monticello Avenue storm drain collection system, and
- WHEREAS, the City has currently funded the estimated \$65,000 for construction of this regional stormwater management facility through a Fiscal Year 2007 General Obligation Bond issue, and
- WHEREAS, it is the City's goal to find cost effective methods to reduce the frequency and extent of flooding throughout the City in general and in the vicinity of the Monticello Avenue storm drain collection system in particular.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Salisbury, Maryland approves the donation of a 16,725.58 square-foot portion of said parcel to the City for use as a regional stormwater management facility.
