

RESOLUTION NO. 1607

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALISBURY, MARYLAND AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY TRAVEL-LANE SHIFTS AND CLOSURES ON JOHNSON ROAD TO FACILITATE IMPROVEMENTS TO JOHNSON ROAD FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND CONVENIENCE.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted rules for temporary travel-lane shifts and closures for the City's streets and highways to ensure public safety and convenience with Resolution 1023; and

WHEREAS, the Developer of the Summersgate project (DEVELOPER) will be constructing roadway-geometric, water, sewer, and storm drain improvements in the City-owned rights of way of Johnson Road which will require temporary vehicular travel-lane shifts and closures (maintaining 2-way traffic at all times) of approximately 45 days in duration; and

WHEREAS, portions of Johnson Road which are County roads, will require temporary travel-lane shifts and closures subject to County approval; and

WHEREAS, the City Council rules established in accordance with Resolution 1023 require a City Council resolution authorizing temporary travel-lane shifts and closures in excess of 30 days for City roadways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salisbury City Council approves the temporary travel-lane shifts and closures on Johnson Road for a period not to exceed 45 calendar days in accordance with a traffic control plan submitted by the DEVELOPER and approved by the Department of Public Works in accordance with the standards of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
